Neighborhood Safety

WHEN TO USE 9-1-1

9-1-1 should be reserved for emergencies to keep the Emergency 9-1-1:

- a person's safety is in immediate peril
- a crime is in progress
- a fight is occurring with a gun, knife or other weapon
- · serious injury needing immediate response
- armed robbery
- a traffic accident with injuries has occurred
- any threat where immediate response is required; when you cannot be placed on hold.

WHAT TO SAY

Some things that you are going to have to tell a dispatcher when you call either 9-1-1 or the non-emergency number:

- location
- name
- nature of emergency/call
- if weapons are involved
- accurate description of suspect or vehicle (including color, make, license # if known)
- direction of travel
- · Remember; never hang up until the dispatcher tells you.

WHEN TO USE THE NON-EMERGENCY NUMBER

The Roseville Police Department non-emergency dispatch lines available. Here is a list of examples of times to use number is (916) 774-5000. This number should be used to report incidents that have already occurred or when no immediate danger is present and suspects are long gone. Here is a list of common examples of when to call the non-emergency number:

- suspicious activity where suspects have vacated
- · crime that has already occurred, Police Department report needed
- traffic accident with no injuries, or traffic hazard
- to contact a specific officer

SUSPICIOUS VEHICLES

Vehicles can be considered suspicious if they are:

- slow moving with headlights turned off
- following a course that appears to be aimless or repetitive especially if occurring around a school, park or playground
- parked cars containing one or more persons, especially at an unusual hour
- abandoned vehicles containing weapons
- property in vehicles especially suspicious when the property includes items not normally found in vehicles.

CAN YOU REPORT ANONYMOUSLY?

Yes! When reporting a crime or suspicious activity, tell the dispatcher that you wish to remain anonymous, if you feel the need. Ask that the officer not come to your door, but call you if they require further information.

Crestmont Park Turf Conversion

Roseville is looking to save water by converting some landscape areas from non-functional turf to drought friendly landscapes. You will soon see signs in conversion areas at Crestmont Park and Roseville's corporation yard. Portions around the park's edge and walking path have been identified for conversion. Look for these projects to get started in the coming months. No play fields or primary recreational areas will be affected or converted. Other parks and city buildings will also undergo similar water saving conversions in the future.
