General Meeting Minutes
April 12, 2016 at 7:00 p.m.
Crestmont Elementary School Multi-Purpose Building

Meeting called to order by President Stephen Costello at 7:03 p.m. Stephen introduced the board and welcomed everyone.

Meeting Minutes: Hearing no objections, the president ordered the March 8, 2016 minutes approved as submitted and placed on file.

Treasurer's Report: The report covers activity from March 1, 2016 to March 31, 2016. The beginning balance was \$973.11. With no activity during the month, the ending balance remains \$973.11. Hearing no objections, the president ordered the treasurer's report placed on file as submitted.

Guest Speaker - John Bennett, Roseville Animal Control Supervisor: Roseville PD's three animal control officers work day shift only and handle over 8,000 calls a year. They handle everything dealing with animals; i.e., go out on calls when officers are dealing with a suspect with a dog, go out with the SWAT team when entering a house with pit bulls, crimes to and against animals, crimes that animals cause such as running loose or biting, pick up dead animals (you should not put any dead animals in solid waste cans), pick up strays and either return to owner if licensed or take to Placer SPCA, take reports on bites from wild and domestic animals, enforce leash and defecation laws, remove skunks and squirrels from school buildings (other problems with skunks are handled by Placer County), trap cats, investigate barking dog, etc. The number one complaint is barking dogs. Dog ownership in Roseville requires licensing and there is a three adult dog limit. Cat laws don't currently exist in Roseville because they are not required to be licensed. You can humanely trap troublesome cats and take them to Placer SPCA.

Numerous off-leash and defecation complaints at Crestmont School and Park have been reported. While park signage may seem conflicting, dogs may be walked on a leash on the bike trail. If dogs are off the bike trail, they are considered in the park and dogs are not allowed in Roseville's parks (except the four designated dog parks). School staff, students, parents and neighbors would love to enjoy a safe and clean park. Signage is being reviewed by the Parks Department and Animal Control. Animal Control encourages schools' support by reminding parents not to walk their dogs up to a school building when dropping or picking up students. People may go on a ride-along with Animal Control.

Guest Speaker - Paul Camilleri, Roseville Code Enforcement Supervisor: Code Enforcement is within the Building Department and primarily handles public nuisance related complaints. Building inspectors check on vacant properties, substandard properties and non-permitted conditions that could be safety issues such as garage conversions. Code Enforcement can enforce any public nuisance which is something that public can see from the public right-of-way (street, sidewalk or alley). Overgrown weeds in the front yard is an example of a public nuisance. Overgrown weeds in a back yard that cannot be seen from the street, sidewalk or alley is an example of a private nuisance. In addition to weeds, other common public nuisances are: accumulation of garbage or trash, basketball hoop encroachment, furniture designed to be indoors being used outdoors and appliances. Violations may be reported by calling the Code Enforcement Hotline, emailing, submitting on website or walking in to City Hall or the Permit Center. Complaints will be routed to the appropriate department. Code Enforcement also works with the Planning Department regarding zoning, setbacks, fences and signs. Questions were taken from the group and responses follow. Signs in the public right-of-way or placed on City property (street light poles, street

signs and masonry walls) are not permitted and will be removed. Only one garage sale sign is allowed for each garage sale and it may only be displayed onsite. Garage sale signs on vehicles near intersections will be researched. The goats will likely be back to get the weeds under control in the open space areas of Roseville. The vernal pool and mosquito concern will be referred to the Open Space Department. CC&Rs are designed to be enforced within the subdivision and not the City. CC&Rs are much more restrictive than the City's ordinances. Sometimes the City's municipal codes mirror a subdivision's CC&Rs so if a municipal code violation occurs, Code Enforcement would handle it. An ordinance amendment going into effect May 6 prohibits parking a commercial vehicle on a residential street if the vehicle has a gross vehicle weight of 10,000 pounds or more. This amendment also prohibits parking upon any unimproved surface (such as landscaping) on residentially zoned properties. In addition, the amount of paving within the front and side yard setback areas is limited to preserve landscaped areas on residential properties. Parking a vehicle over a sidewalk is encroachment and in violation.

Reports/Old Business

Roseville Police Officer Neighborhood Report: Officer Cameron Landon said vehicle thefts continue and we have a bit more traffic enforcement because of recent traffic complaints. Most arrests come from citizens providing good tips, so please report suspicious activity. Officer Landon asked about any concerns and here are his responses. Motor officer enforcement will be requested again for the continuing speeding and cutting through the neighborhood on Old Hart Ranch Road and Vista Creek Drive during rush hour traffic (4:30 – 5:30 p.m.). People are attempting to avoid the traffic backup on Old Auburn Road. Various recreational vehicles are not street legal so please report them. Roseville's Street Engineering Department determines the speed limits throughout the City and Paul Camilleri will forward the concern about South Cirby Way's speed limit and the resulting difficulty pulling out of the subdivision off Nighthawk Circle. Checking Nextdoor.com or other social media when a helicopter announcement is not clear enough is a great idea; please don't call dispatch. Sign up for eNotify, www.roseville.ca.us/enotify, to receive various types of notices from the City, including public safety and neighborhood news. AB 109 Prison Realignment allows low level drug offense prisoners to be out and about on parole. Since the passage of Proposition 47 in 2014, penalties for common drug and theft crimes in California are reduced from potential felonies to misdemeanors, shortening the time some offenders spend behind bars. Meth and heroin users are back out on the streets quickly and cause many problems.

Neighborhood Watch (NW): The next NW informational meeting is May 24, 2016, from 12:00 – 1:00 p.m. at the Roseville PD (Mark White Room).

Movie in the Park: Stephen announced that SCNA will be hosting an RCONA Movie in the Park, *Field of Dreams*, on Saturday, July 9th, at Crestmont Park.

New Business

Annual Meeting and Election: Stephen announced our upcoming June 14th Annual Meeting and Election and encouraged people that are interested to run for a board position to submit a short paragraph bio including the position desired by May 9th to www.scna.rcona.com. Volunteering was also encouraged.

Closed Group Facebook Pages: Cesar established two South Cirby neighborhood closed group Facebook pages; one dedicated for neighborhood news and another dedicated to "for sale or free" items.
