This is a general overview of the FBI including internet safety and will be appropriate for all ages.

The information below is being shared by the FBI. Parents and their children should exercise caution when posting information on any social media platform.

Major FBI Resources for Families:

- **FBI Safe Online Surfing** is internet safety education for grades 3-8 that matches both state and federal curricula mandates. Each grade level has an age-appropriate module that builds a child's skill set to identify, avoid, and report bullying, predators, and online schemes while reinforcing the need to report incidents they or their friends experience to protect others.

- **FBI Child ID** is a free app developed by the FBI and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC). In addition to safety tips and checklists to follow if a child is missing, the app can password protect and store biometric data, photos, and more so parents or guardians do not need to try to remember the details during a crisis. All data is stored exclusively on the phone and is neither kept by the app developers nor capable of being uploaded to the cloud for your family's safety. Information can be quickly sent to law enforcement or NCMEC after initial contact by initiating a one-click feature that automatically populates an email with the stored data; a parent or guardian only needs to enter an email address.
