Summer Safety Tips from National Crime Prevention Council

Home Safety Tips

- Be aware of what's happening in the neighborhood. Stay connected via Neighborhood Watch or a "Nextdoor" group.
- Lock your doors, including the garage door. Unlocked doors are open invitations to intruders.
- Ask a trusted family member, friend, or neighbor to keep a watchful eye on your home and pick up any packages or mail; or have your mail held at the local post office until your return.
- Put lights on timers to give the impression that someone is home.
- Don't post on social media that you are leaving town. Wait to post photos after you return from your trip.

Tips for Parents

- During a family outing make a backup plan in case the group gets separated. Consider having a scheduled meeting place and
- If your children will be home alone for a significant amount of time, have them check in with you if they plan to leave the house and when they arrive back home.
- Monitor internet and social media activity to establish if your children are visiting appropriate sites and following guidelines.

Car Safety Tips

- Always lock your doors and roll up your windows when you leave your car.
- Do not leave valuables in the car. If you must leave prized possessions in your vehicle, keep them out of sight or hidden in the trunk.
