# Watering Days Now in Effect

Table reduced to show just residential rules for May through August.

Customer	Time of Year	Watering Days	No Irrigation During
Residential	1st day of May – last day of August	Monday, Wednesday and Friday	10 a.m. to 8 p.m.
All	Drip irrigation is exempt from watering day restrictions.		

In our current Stage 2 drought, we have watering day restrictions. Note also that irrigation on those days (Monday, Wednesday and Friday) is not to take place between 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. However, there are no restrictions on drip irrigation.

In dealing with non-drip irrigation, there are a couple strategies you can employ to maximize the water you apply:

- Break longer cycles into shorter ones with time in between. For example, your soil has a better chance to absorb water without run-off with two shorter 5 minute cycles with an hour break in between, than doing a single 10 minute cycle.
- Use a moisture meter or dig down six inches or so to check the real situation where plant roots are rather than relying on eyeballing the state of your plants, or knowing the weather is predicted to be hot and dry.

Roseville Coalition of Neighborhood Associations (RCONA) requires a minimum of four (4) board volunteers to retain "Active Neighborhood Association" status. If you are submitting someone else's name, please confirm with them their willingness to serve prior to nominating them.

The Slate of Candidates (names and short biographies only) will be posted on our website, <u>scna.rcona.com</u>, by September 11th for our elections on October 11th and will remain posted until after the elections. All residents are encouraged to review the Slate of Candidates and attend the Annual Meeting and Election of Board Members. Only those present at the meeting may vote (no proxy votes or floor nominations allowed).
