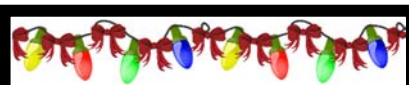

## Take Precautions when Using Zelle and Other Peer-to-Peer (P2P) Payment Methods

These tips are from Rob Baquera, Public Information Officer. Go to [Take Precautions when Using Peer-to-Peer Payments](#) for his entire article.

- Only send money to people you know and trust. Never Zelle yourself. Once you send money through Zelle, you cannot cancel. It's like sending cash.
- Make sure you have the correct email address or mobile phone number for your recipient.
- Be wary of unexpected communication claiming to be from your bank, utility company, or any service provider. People demanding payment from P2P, a gift card, or via Western Union are likely scammers.
- Sense of urgency payments should raise a red flag. If someone claiming to be a person that you do business with demands immediate payment, stop your communication with them. Contact that company with the phone number you know to be legitimate.
- Never click on a text link from an entity you don't know, and never answer a call from an unfamiliar number. Remember scammers can spoof numbers so that it looks like it's really coming from your bank, credit card company, etc.
- Before initializing a large transfer of money, talk to a family member or friend.
- Guard your personal information.
- Maximize your safety settings. Most popular payment apps allow users to enable multifactor authentication. It's a way to safeguard your personal information and protect yourself from fraud and scams.
