April 10, 2024 – Meeting Minutes

Present: President Colleen Cole, Vice President Charlie Colato, Treasurer Stephanie Oliver, Board Members LaRon Golden and Peggy Hartman. Absent: Secretary Liz Krohn and Member at Large (MAL) Kevin Crow. Police and Fire representatives were not present. Guests: Erika Arrends and Wendi Fuerstenberger.

The meeting was called to order by President Colleen Cole at 7:00 p.m. A quorum was established for voting. Previous minutes from the January 10, 2024 meeting were approved by email and placed on file.

Treasurer Stephanie Oliver presented the beginning and ending balances for January through March of \$2,442.23 with no income or expenses reported in January, February or March.

Reports/Old Business:

Permanent Park Bench Located in Crestmont Park

LaRon submitted our request to the City of Roseville for purchasing a permanent cement park bench. No payment or submission of plaque inscription is needed until a location is determined by the City. The most recent communication from Brian is that they are still looking for suitable locations.

Colleen contacted two teachers and a journalist to be sure the statement we voted on in January is grammatically correct as the words “Make” or “Makes” both work in the statement. It depends on whether or not we want the emphasis on the word “Neighbors” or “Helping”. It was decided to keep the emphasis on the word “Neighbors”. Our statement will be centered in three lines: Neighbors Helping Neighbors Make a Difference, Donated by South Cirby Neighborhood Association, 2024.

New Business:

RCONA/City of Roseville Spring Cleanup

Colleen shared our April newsletter with information on the spring cleanup. Everyone is encouraged to sign up for a shift. SCNA is responsible for providing volunteers for the May 18 event at Bridgeway Church, 8150 Industrial Avenue. We are also responsible that day for bringing water and food for all volunteers. Whoever purchases the water and food will be reimbursed \$100 by RCONA and the remainder of the expense will be divided among the five assigned neighborhood associations. Pricing and food safety was discussed. Granola bars might be a better option than sandwiches. Colleen will check further on this.

Placer County Elections RCONA Service Group

In March, SCNA earned \$150 by volunteering as RCONA Service Group runners in the primary election. This was for three short shifts. The payment will be automatically deposited into our checking account by the RCONA treasurer.

Placer County Elections has awarded the RCONA Service Group an 11-day assignment at the Martha Riley voting center beginning Saturday, October 26 through Tuesday, November 5. Please consider this opportunity to volunteer and help SCNA raise funds. Also, spread the word to friends and neighbors to help us.

RCONA NNO Reimbursement for Neighborhood Associations

In 2024, RCONA will reimburse neighborhood associations up to \$200 (with receipts) for a National Night Out event rather than up to \$100.

2024 Planning/Budgeting – Tabled from January Meeting

After discussing the SCNA 2024 Proposed Budget, a motion was made to approve the budget. Motion carried 5-0 (Vice President Colato/MAL Hartman).

Items Not on the Agenda – Time Permitting

Annual Garage Sale date possibilities of September 14, 21 or beginning of October were discussed. Last year's garage sale was September 16. Revisit at May meeting.
