May 8, 2024 – Meeting Minutes

Present: President Colleen Cole, Secretary Liz Krohn, Member at Large (MALs) LaRon Golden and Peggy Hartman.

Absent: Vice President Charlie Colato, Treasurer Stephanie Oliver, and Member at Large (MAL) Kevin Crow.

The meeting was called to order by President Colleen Cole at 7:00pm. A quorum was established for voting. Previous minutes from the April 10th meeting were approved and placed on file. There was no Treasurer's report.

Action Items:

Placer County Supervisor Suzanne Jones, District 4 presented oversight, interesting projects, and fielded questions.

Placer County administrative offices oversee Court Services, Sheriff's Office, Probation, County Jail, and contracts for Mental Health services in this region to satisfy the number of beds required.

Actions:

- District Attorney Morgan Gire and his department have provided placards to businesses for the retail theft prosecution program as a hope to deter crime in this county.
- Two convictions due to fentanyl death have been prosecuted.
- Bosch is planning to acquire TSI Semiconductors and produce components for electric cars. This will be a significant economic boost.
- Impact fees for development and transportation tax were explained.
- Assessment of 1219 affordable units of housing in the county will result in rezoning and identification of land required to achieve those goals.

Supervisor Jones concluded her presentation by asking for questions and offering additional time by appointment to discuss concerns.

Roseville Police Department Gareth Watkins provided an update on area policing efforts.

The two biggest programs involve traffic and transients. With expanding growth comes issues of traffic, housing shortages, residential services, and available schools.

Retail theft involves not only educating through signage but also enforcement by individual businesses willing to prosecute crime.

President Cole thanked Supervisor Jones and Officer Watkins for their reports and time.
